

Riverton, West Farmington River



The Farmington, always a great place to catch fish, is also enjoyed by these friends of the river. As you can see, this is an early autumn photo with some reflection of the tops of changing trees. For this spot, approach West River Road from Riverton Road, and drive 0.4 miles. There is a pullover on the right, and a sign that says “Trophy Trout Stream” on the left. The pullover is large enough for 4 cars. (Looks like a popular spot).

The interesting part of this entry is that there are two paths to the river. The right one is actually steps, made from railroad ties. The steps are 3-4 inches high. The path on the left is a gentle downhill slope. Our handicapped person had difficulty climbing back up the steps, as the tallest was just over 4 inches, and needed help to stay in balance. So, keep a firm hand on your friend’s lower back when returning via the steps.

The stream is wade-able all the way across, and up and down.
